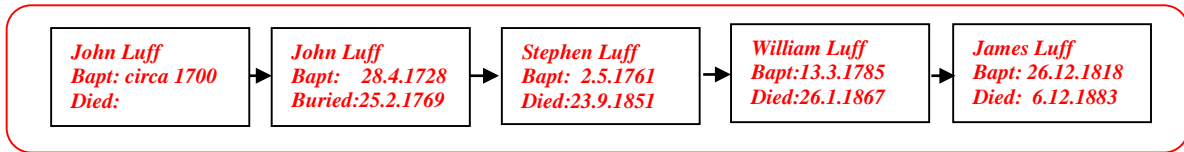


Frederick George Luff 1866 - 1932

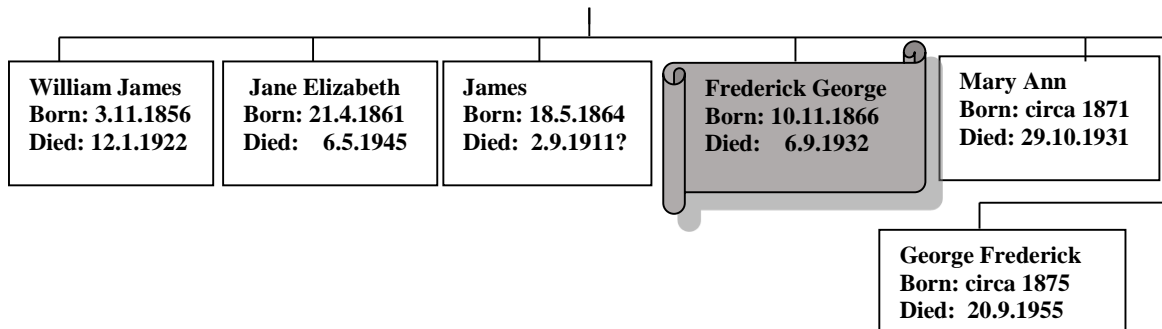
Family Lineage:

Extract from Sheldrake's Aldershot and Sandhurst Military Gazette dated Saturday February 3, 1877
 Aldershot Petty Sessions. Reporting that Frederick Luff, James Luff, Jane Luff, along with others were found guilty of damaging rifle butts at Aldershot barracks on 24th January, 1877. Frederick Luff was 11 years old, Jane Luff was 16 years old and James Luff (the author's great grandfather) was 14 years old at the time.

the case to be dealt with by the military authorities, and the prisoner was accordingly handed over to the escort.

DAMAGING RIFLE BUTTS.

George Stephens, who was previously convicted for begging, was again placed in the dock charged with damaging the rifle butts.—14 days' imprisonment.

George Stephens (same prisoner as before) *Frederick Luff*, *James Luff*, *Jane Luff*, *Rose Whiting*, *Alfred Whiting*, *Mary Ann Whiting*, and *James Burgess*, were severally charged with maliciously damaging the rifle butts on 24th January.—P.C. Shrimpton stated that he was on duty at the rifle butts on the 24th January, and saw the eight defendants there tearing down the butts with hoes and target stays. They ran away when he came up. He caught *Mary Ann Whiting*, and found 2½lbs. of lead in her possession.—A private in the 64th Regt., who had charge of the rifle butts, said the damage done was to the extent of £1.—*Frederick Luff*, *Rose Whiting*, and *Alfred Whiting* (being their first appearance) were fined 8s. each, or 7 days imprisonment. *Jane Luff*, *James Burgess*, *Jane Luff*, *Mary Ann Whiting*, and *George Stevens* were fined 15s. each or 14 days imprisonment. Allowed a month for payment, except *Stephens* who elected to go to prison.

 Frederick Luff would have been 12 years old at the time.

Frederick Luff and *Wm. May*, two boys, were charged with damaging the rifle butts, near Caesar's Camp.

Police constable *Creeker*, Metropolitan Police, said that he saw the prisoners tearing down the face of the butts on the 9th inst searching for lead. He took them into custody and found the lead produced in *Luff's* pocket.

Private *Robinson* said he found the targets pulled down and the lead pulled away. *Luff* who had been convicted twice for a similar offence, was fined 10s. 6d. and *May* 7s. 6d.

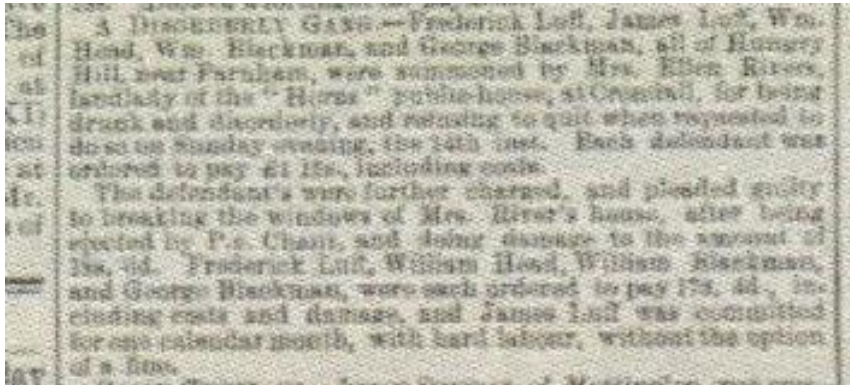

Transcript:

A DISORDERLY GANG – Frederick Luff, James Luff, Wm. Head, Wm. Blackman, and George Blackman, all of Hungry Hill near Farnham, were summonsed by Mrs Ellen Rivers, landlady of the “Horns” public-house, at Crondall, for being drunk and disorderly, and refusing to quit when requested to do so on Sunday evening the 14th instant. Each defendant was ordered to pay £1 15s, including costs.

The defendants were further charged, and pleaded guilty, to breaking the windows of Mrs River’s house, after being ejected by P.c. Chant, and doing damage to the amount of 18s 6d. Frederick Luff, William Head, William Blackman and George Blackman, were each ordered to pay 17s 4d, including costs and damage, and James Luff was committed for one calendar month, with hard labour, without the option of a fine.

Frederick Luff would have been about 24 years old at the time. James, his older brother, (the author’s great grandfather) would have been 26 years old.

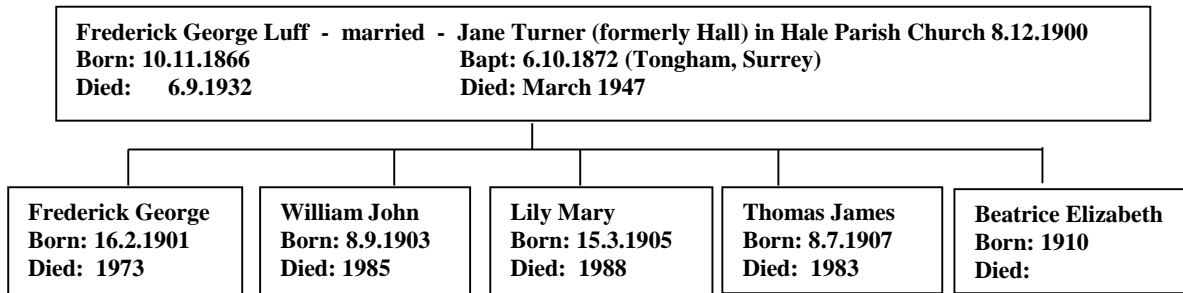

Frederick married Jane Turner in Hale Parish Church, on 8th December, 1900. (*Source: Official Marriage certificate*) They had both been widowed. Jane Turner (neé Hall) married Robert Turner in Hale on 23rd August, 1891. Robert Turner died in 1898 (aged 37) in Farnham. They had one child, Lucy Turner who was baptized in Hale on 30th July, 1893.

I have been unable to find a reference to the previous marriage of Frederick George Luff.

The 1901 Census shows Frederick, now aged 32, and his wife Jane were living at Patricks Cottages, Heath End. Also in the household were Lucy Turner, Frederick's step-daughter aged 7, and his and Jane's son Frederick George aged 1 month.

The 1911 Census shows Frederick, now aged 40 his real aged was probably 45, and Jane his wife had 5 children, the family were living at 1, Hillside Cottages, Heath End. Frederick states his employment as a building labourer.
