

The 1851 Census shows Richard, aged 30 single and employed as a gardener, visiting a household in Collings Road, St Peter Port.

Further records show that Richard Stephen seem to be the 'Black sheep' of the family.

Below is an extract from the Town Hospital Records, on the subject of Richard Stephen Luff:

Extracts from the Town Hospital (Workhouse) Records

NAME Richard Stephen Luff

BOOK REF. DC/HX 75-02

31 March 1852 (p. 223)

R.S. Luff, aged 32, son of Richard, native of this parish (St Peter Port), drunkard and a bad sort, brought in by Constable De Saumarez.

23 September 1852 (p. 257)

R.S. Luff, released by the treasurers. The said Luff going to take passage to South Australia, which his father would pay.

BOOK REF. DC/HX 130-04

14 February 1860 (p. 315) Richard Luff, aged 39, son of Richard, being homeless and in need, received by sanction of the acting Vice President.

Continued.....

29 June 1860 (p. 328) Richard Luff released by the acting Vice President.

4 January 1861 (p. 348) Richard Luff, aged 40, bad sort, left prison and homeless, received by order of the Constable.

2 February 1861 (p. 352)

Richard Luff released by the acting Vice President. On the 7th he is returned after having been 24 hours in prison.

18 June 1861 (p. 363)

Richard Luff (and others named) having taken passage for Weymouth, going to Liverpool, for emigrating to Quebec at their request and at the cost of the Board of Management, by the deliberations of the 6th May and of the 3rd June 1861. They are under the care of Mr Jean Williams.

It appears that Richard married a widow by the name of McGee in South America.

I have no further information about Richard.
