
<u>Stephen Luff 1761 - 1851</u>

(The author's Great-Great-Great-Great-Grandfather)

Stephen Luff was baptised at St Andrew's Church, Farnham, on 2nd May 1761. He was the son of John Luff. The record shows that, at the time of his birth, John Luff his father and family resided in Compton, a small hamlet a mile from Farnham.


Extract from the St Andrew's Church records showing the baptism of Stephen Luff.

Below is an extract from the 1871 Ordnance Survey Map of the Farnham area. The hamlet of Compton is shown, and it is clear that even a hundred years after the birth of Stephen Luff there were very few dwellings in the area. The School shown was not there in 1761. I can only surmise that the employment of Stephen's father was as a sawyer or gardener.



The siblings of Stephen, as shown below, are all children of John Luff. I have been unable to prove categorically that they are Stephen's brothers and sisters.



Stephen Luff married Mary Mayne on 28th December 1784 at St Andrew's Church, Farnham.

Extract from St Andrew's Church records showing the marriage of Stephen Luff and Mary Mayne, is below. Mary Mayne writes her own name, however the Church official records her surname as Maine. For a woman to be able to write her own name is probably the exception rather than the rule in this class of person at this time in history. But as stated in my introduction, Mary seems to have come from a well- educated family. Stephen, who was illiterate, was living in the Parish of Aldershott (now spelt Aldershot) at the time of the marriage. Mary Mayne was from the Parish of Farnham. Witnesses to the marriage were Thomas Pisely (who seems to have been a church official, and was a substantial landowner) and Peter Hughes who was the owner of the Malthouse and hopgrounds in Farnham. This suggests to me that Stephen, as a labourer, would probably have been highly thought of by his employer, Peter Hughes.



The marriage produced the following recorded children:



It is interesting that some of the children were baptized at St Andrew's Church, Farnham and some at St Michael's Church, Aldershot:

William was baptized at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, on 13th March, 1785.

Sarah was baptized at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, on 4th March, 1787.

Stephen was baptized at St Andrew's Church, Farnham, on 25th December, 1789.

Jane was baptized at St Andrew's Church, Farnham, on 28th December, 1791.

Richard was baptized at St Andrew's Church Farnham, on 9th February, 1794.

Lucy was baptized at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, on 13th March, 1796

Hannah was probably not baptized but certainly buried at St Michael's Church, Aldershot on 28th June, 1799.

James was baptized at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, on 16th November, 1800.

Charlotte was baptized at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, on 25th December, 1802.


It seems likely therefore that Stephen and Mary lived in Aldershot from the time of their marriage in 1784 to 1787. Three children were baptized in Farnham between 1789 and 1794, so it seems likely that the family probably lived in Farnham during that period.

From 1795, when Sarah died at the age of 8 and was buried at St Michael's Church, Aldershot, all subsequent children were baptized/died in Aldershot. Mary, Stephen's wife was buried in Aldershot in 1802. Stephen was an agricultural labourer, and it seems likely that he was employed in the hop fields which could be found in and around the Aldershot and Farnham areas. This could also be a reason why the family moved between Farnham and Aldershot.

Mary, Stephen's wife, died and was buried in St Michael's Church, Aldershot on 10th November 1802. The following is an extract from the burial records of St Michael's Church, Aldershot.

Map of Aldershot showing position of St Michael the Archangel






St Michael the Archangel Church, Aldershot.

Stephen then remarried. His new wife was Sarah Patrick who was born circa 1785 in Elstead, Surrey.



In the 1841 Census Stephen, now aged 80, was living in Ash, which was part of Aldershott, along with his second wife Sarah, and the two youngest children Robert and Emma. Stephen is recorded as being employed as an agricultural labourer




Extract from the 1841 Census for Aldershott, taken on 6th June, 1841.

The 1851 Census shows Stephen still employed as an agricultural labourer in his 90th year. Sarah was employed as an agricultural labourer. Living in the home was Robert their son, single aged 27, and also employed as an agricultural labourer, also their daughter Emma, single, aged 23.

On the Census Stephen confirms that he was born in Farnham.

Extract from the 1851 Census taken on the night of 30th March 1851, for Aldershott, Hampshire.



Stephen died on 23rd September 1851. He died in Aldershot of natural decay (old age). His youngest daughter Emma was present at his death. Stephen was 90 years old when he died. (*Source: Official Death Certificate*)

Stephen's wife Sarah died on 13th October, 1856. She died as the result of diarrhoea which she had had for 3 weeks. Present at her death was her youngest daughter Emma Luff. (*Source: Official Death certificate*)

Sarah Luff was living in Hungry Hill, Hale when she died, but was buried at Michael's Church, Aldershot on 18th October, 1856. She was 71 years old. It could be that she wanted to be buried at the same place as her late husband, Stephen, who was buried in Aldershot.
